For Test Takers aged 16 or 17

If you are aged 16 or 17 then you will need signed permission from your parent or guardian before you can take the test.

1. First make sure you have registered your personal details online:
 - 1.1.1. Click register and you will be taken to the registration pages. Next,
 - 1.1.2. Click 'Schedule Online' and then 'Create a Web Account'.
 - 1.1.3. Fill out your personal details, making sure your name is written in exactly the same way as it appears on your photo ID.
2. Next log in to your account and make a note of your PTE ID:
 - 2.1.1. Your login details will be sent to the email address with which you registered.
 - 2.1.2. In some cases, if your personal details are similar to somebody else's it may take a little longer to send you your login details, as we will need to make sure that you haven't already registered. Sometimes this can take up to 48 hours.
 - 2.1.3. Once you have logged in you will find your PTE ID at the top of the 'Current Activity' page.
3. Ask your parent or guardian to print out, complete and sign the parental consent form:
 - 3.1.1. Make sure that your name is written in exactly the same way as you registered it online. Make sure your PTE ID is included on the form.
